This story is inspired by a little boy in our area who knows this first hand, but this could be anyone's story. The need for blood donations goes up during the holidays and summer months. Typically, these increases are due to traffic accidents that also increase during the busy travel times of the year. But for some, this need could happen at any time. We have the power to save a life and it only takes about an hour of our time.

Here are some simple facts:

1 in 7 people entering a hospital require blood or it's products

1 pint is all that is needed to save 3 lives

More than 15 million pints are transfused in the U.S. each year

Blood cannot be artificially made

Every 2 seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood

Less than 10% of the population that is eligible to date blood does so

It is a misconception that accident victims require the most blood, but that simply is not true. The bulk of blood products are given to:

People being treated for cancers

Undergoing orthopedic surgeries

Undergoing organ and marrow transplants



Being treated for inherited blood disorders

One unit of blood can be separated into the following components:




Nearly half the volume of blood consists of cells, which include red blood cells, white blood cells, and platelets. The remainder is a fluid called plasma.

Major disasters do not usually require large amounts of blood, and in most cases hospitals rely on the blood that is already on their shelves to save lives.

But that's when blood centers see the greatest outpouring of support from donors. Blood is needed everyday. You can help blood centers fill every request for blood by making sure it is available before it's needed.

Included below are charts that breakdown the usage of both red blood cells and platelets with U.S. hospitals.



So back to the inspiration of this story. 5 year old Riley Osmon has been battling leukemia for 3 1/2 years now. In these past years Riley has had many ups and downs. Recently he has had many more downs than up. During these trying times, when his parents are asked by so many, "what can we do to help you out?"- the response has been, "give blood. Riley has required many life saving blood products. You may not be Riley's blood type but your donation may save the life of another child on our floor or someone else's loved one."


